FamilyMart deploys restocking robots to ease staffing crunch

Japanese convenience store chain FamilyMart will take on robots to restock refrigerated beverage shelves, helping to cut branch's workload by about 20%. The robots, developed by Tokyo startup Telexistence, will be added to 300 FamilyMart outlets by the end of March 2025 and stationed behind refrigerated cases to replenish drinks. The machines will use image recognition technology to automatically restock products when needed. By essentially eliminating the role of staff from the process, the system is expected to save a store 10 hours' worth of labor costs per day. Source: asia.nikkei.com





Tesco says goodbye to staffed checkouts as it prioritizes self-service in store revamp

The UK's biggest supermarket **Tesco** is removing the majority of manned checkouts from many of its larger stores, as it moves towards a greater focus on self-service. The retailer said it has made the decision following a "lack of customer demand" for manned checkouts. While several staffed checkouts will remain in place, it will see a significant change in store layout which some experts believe will allow Tesco to capitalize on the space left by the tills. Coles trials the removal of single-use plastic fresh produce bags

Coles will remove single-use plastic fresh produce bags in Australian Capital Territory (ACT) supermarkets in a trial which will encourage shoppers to bring in reusable options for their fruit and veggies. For the first two weeks in September, shoppers who spend \$5 in store on fruit and veggies will receive a free



3-pack of reusable mesh fresh produce bags – made with 90% recycled materials – in preparation for singleuse plastic bags being removed from stores from 14 September.
